HORSE ARENA SIZE GUIDE How Are You Riding?







Disciplines & Arena Sizes

Below is a list of common riding disciplines, along with their recommended arena sizes.

Western Disciplines

Barrel Racing: 130 ft by 200 ft, must accommodate clover leaf pattern

Cutting: Typical arena setting

Pole Bending: Must accommodate six-pole pattern, with 21 feet between poles; $100 \text{ ft} \times 200 \text{ ft}$ is one possibility

Reining: <u>100 ft × 200 ft</u> (small) and <u>150 ft × 300 ft</u> (large) are two options; this discipline has several different patterns, but a circular endwall works best

Roping: $120 \text{ ft} \times 250 \text{ ft}$ (small) or $150 \text{ ft} \times 325 \text{ ft}$ (large) are both good options

Team Penning: 100 ft by 200 ft

Western Pleasure: <u>66 ft x 132 ft</u> (practice), <u>80 ft by 140 ft</u> (practice), <u>100 ft by 200 ft</u> (competition)

English Disciplines	Eventing: This is for show; a nice option to keep your arena sheltered is a pavilion
	Hunter: Done outside on a controlled course
	Polo: <u>50 ft by 100 ft</u> (indoor) or <u>150 ft by 300 ft</u> (outdoor)
	Saddle Seat: Numerous patterns, check out arabianhorses.org for more info!
	Show Jumping: <u>66 ft by 132 ft</u> (small), <u>100 ft by 200 ft</u> (medium), <u>262 ft by 388 ft</u> (Olympic)
Both	Dressage: Standard is typically <u>100 ft by 200 ft</u>
English & Western	Therapeutic: <u>100 ft by 200 ft</u>
	Trail Riding: When riding up to 40 miles or so daily, an optimal space to return home to will encourage happy horses
Other	
Other	Driving: Could be done in a large arena, but even if driving traditionally in a field, the horses still need shelter


Endurance: This is trail riding, but make sure the horses have a comforting


